**Veterans Awards Ceremony  
at the  
Thomson-Hood Veterans Center**

In the month of February the *Newsletter* is covering a ceremony that took place in November at the Thomson-Hood Veterans Center. Because we love and honor our veterans, it really doesn't matter which month we show our appreciation for their service to this great nation.

Several men and one woman were honored on November 17, 2006 at the THVC. The ceremony started with Clara Carson-Crain who served in the Women's US Army Auxiliary Corps in 1943. She was presented an Honorable Discharge & Letter of Appreciation.

Harold Hughes, Wayne Rowland, Manuel Anderson, Gilbert Mc Guire, James Winkler, William Anderson, and Glen McQuillien were presented the COLD WAR CERTIFICATE - In accordance with section 1084 of the Fiscal Year 1998 National Defense on Act, the Recognition Certificates were given to all members of the armed forces and qualified federal government civilian during the Cold War era, from September 2, 1945 to December 26, 1991.

The Citation read as follows;

**CITATION:** In recognition of your service during the period of the Cold War (2 September 1945 – 26 December 1991) in promoting peace and stability for this Nation, the people of this Nation are forever grateful.

Bill Anderson was awarded the GOOD CONDUCT/NATIONAL DEFENSE medal.

Manuel Anderson received the GOOD CONDUCT/NATIONAL DEFENSE & AIRBORNE WINGS medal.

Ed White was awarded the following: DISTINGUISHED FLYING CROSS, AIR MEDAL w/ 3 BRONZE STARS, GOOD CONDUCT MEDAL, AMERICAN CAMPAIGN MEDAL, ASIATIC-PACIFIC CAMPAIGN MEDAL, WORLD WAR II VICTORY MEDAL and the HONORABLE SERVICE LAPEL BUTTON WWII.

Curtis Johnson earned the Combat Infantryman Badge for his service with the Army during WWII. Soldiers who earned this award (CIB) were also authorized in 1947 to be retroactively entitled the Bronze Star medal.

## **Wilmore Post Office to Host "Passport Fair"**

Beginning **January 23, 2007**, ALL persons traveling by **air** between the US and Canada, Mexico, Central and South America, the Caribbean, and Bermuda will be required to present a valid passport, Air NEXUS card, US Coast Guard Merchant Mariner Document, or an Alien Registration Card. In response, the Wilmore Post Office is hosting a "Passport Fair" on **Saturday, February 24, from 10am to 2pm**. It is recommended that you apply for your passport at least 2 months before your departure to avoid extra costs involved in expediting your application. **Just bring a few things with you and we'll take care of the rest:**

- 1. Passport Application (available at the event)**
- 2. Proof of U.S. Citizenship**
- 3. Proof of Identity**
- 4. Passport Photos (we can take your photo here)**
- 5. Passport Fees (check or money order)**
