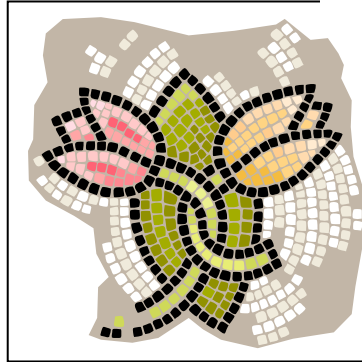

**“Jessamine County dedicates  
W. N. Cassity building  
that will serve the public  
for at least a century”**

On March 26, Jessamine County officials and employees as well as members of the public at large gathered at 117 South Main Street in Nicholasville, just around the corner from the Courthouse, to celebrate the opening of the W. N. Cassity Building with a dedication and open house.

As they celebrate, they'll stand where just a year or so ago, a large, unsightly gap marked what seemed to be the complete devastation by fire of a large chunk of Nicholasville's historic downtown buildings. Because of the efforts of Jessamine County Judge/Executive Wm. Neal Cassity and other county officials to protect and preserve the historic downtown area, the W. N. Cassity Building is now a “truly beautiful building,” and a building “designed to serve the Jessamine County public for at least a century or more,” according to County Attorney Brian Goettl.

the County Attorney's offices, which are paid for by the state, this building will virtually pay for itself,” said Cassity.

“Because we're leasing the building's offices spaces, and in particular, because we're leasing to

The County Attorney's offices take up approximately 4,600 square feet (one-third of the building's square footage) – the ALC (judicial branch of county government) including pretrial services, a juvenile intake worker, and family court

are leasing space in the building. “We'll eventually have a misdemeanor drug court in the building, also,” Judge Cassity said. “It will be the first one in county history.”

Judge Cassity chose to run the job “in the most economical way possible” by using Jessamine County workers – including road, maintenance and even some County Jail residents on work release – to do much of the construction and site work. In doing so, he created approximately \$265,000 in total savings, according to the building construction's Project Manager John Dalton.

Refreshments were served during the dedication and open house; tours of the building were also provided.

This was truly a way to honor one of Jessamine County's most beloved leaders. Judge Cassity in his remarks stated, “I just love Jessamine County... he also thanked the many people who served on committees and the approximately 150 on site workers.

**GROUNDBREAKING HELD AT CAMP NELSON FOR BARRACKS**

Groundbreaking for a reconstructed barracks building was held on Saturday, March 15 at the Camp Nelson Civil War Heritage Park in conjunction with the annual meeting of the Camp Nelson Restoration and Preservation Foundation. The new addition to the Park will enhance interpretation at the site by replicating a barracks as it was originally at Camp Nelson in the 1860's. The building, which is in the vicinity of the White House and Interpretive Center, will also include a genealogical research facility with research materials and equipment.

Funding for the construction of the 3,192 sq.ft. building was made possible through a state legislative appropriation. Other resources include funding and in-kind services through the Jessamine County Fiscal Court along with local donations.

Jessamine County Judge-Executive Wm. Neal Cassity commented that “Jessamine County is proud of the role Camp Nelson played in the history of our nation and is committed to its continued preservation.

The 525-acre Camp Nelson Civil War Heritage Park is owned and maintained by the Jessamine County Fiscal Court. Michael Crutcher, Chairman of the Camp Nelson Foundation, noted, “The barracks

building will be an excellent addition to the Park which will aid us in educating the public about the national significance of Camp Nelson.”

Camp Nelson, located on US 27 about 6 miles south of Nicholasville, was established in 1863 and served as a strategic quartermaster depot, recruitment and training center and hospital for Union troops in the Kentucky and eastern Tennessee region during the Civil War. The camp is most significant as the largest recruitment and training center for African Americans in Kentucky and third largest in the country. Camp Nelson is a Lincoln Bicentennial site and is part of the National Underground Railroad Network to Freedom.
