Coalition for Clean Indoor Air in Jessamine County

Smoke Free Jessamine Coalition has been formed to promote the adoption of a smoking ordinance for our community. This would involve the adoption of an ordinance similar to Fayette County and other surrounding communities. It is an ordinance that's being adopted all around us for the protection of workers' health and rather than allow our community and others to be pre-empted by a state law such as Tennessee adopted, we would like to support a transition into an ordinance adoption in our community. It is always better to adopt at a community level rather than have a state law supersede our local laws.

The research is overwhelming in the support that not only smoking, but that Second Hand Smoke exposure (due to the toxins that enter the air after it's chemicals have been heated)

CAUSES CANCER AND CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASE! Even if you're a smoker, do you want this for your family members? Research proves that the heart is hardened and blood flow is decreased after only 5 FIVE minutes of exposure to second hand smoke...If you don't smoke, but don't mind sitting in a restaurant or other public facility that allows smoking, have you thought about the person who can't find another job that's being exposed to the same smoke for an 8 hour work day? We can decrease asthma attacks amongst our family members by 50% and reduce the amount of Emergency Room visits by as much from our asthmatics and cardiovascular patients. Also, have you thought about your family members that can't go out to eat or into any of the smoke filled facilities because of their health conditions? Did you even know that those people existed in our Community? Would you like to be stuck at home because of the smoke filled atmospheres you would encounter if you went out with friends?

Evidence based research overwhelmingly supports that the adoption of a smoke free ordinance does not hurt, but rather boosts business income and cuts down on the expense of upkeep and repairs to businesses/restaurants. It also allows for a more clean community. So, it only makes sense to protect the members of our community including our own families. Please know that I am working to educate the community and assist in support between our community and

Legislative leaders. Our coalition includes representatives from the American Cancer Society, the American Heart Association, the American Lung Association, UK Tobacco Research, the Jessamine County Health Department, and other professional persons such as me who want to support the well being of our town, including members of the community just like you. Asbury Theological Seminary offers FedEx shipping to the entire Wilmore community - in time to send Christmas packages in a hurry.

Bring your ready-to-ship package to the Asbury Seminary Post Office Monday - Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Ship packages using any of FedEx's services, including Express, 2-Day, Express Saver (3-Day) or Ground.

Ground shipments must be received by 11:00 a.m. to go out that day. Express shipments must be received by 3:30 p.m. to go out the same day.

Accepted forms of payment include cash, Visa, MasterCard and Discover.

The Asbury Theological Seminary Post Office (SPO) is located on the ground floor of the Henry Clay Morrison Administration Building, which faces N. Lexington Avenue.

If you park on N. Lexington Avenue, enter through the front door of the Henry Clay Morrison Building and take the elevator to the ground floor. There is also convenient visitor and 15-minute parking located behind the Bettie Morrison Apartments. From East Main Street, turn onto Spring Street where you'll see the Physical Plant on the left. Turn left at the Physical Plant and follow the drive to Parking Lot M.
