

WILMORE SUMMER RECREATION 2008

GENERAL POLICIES/PROCEDURES

ELIGIBILITY OF CAMPERS

As of June 9, 2008, campers must be at least 5 years of age and no older than 13 years of age to attend Wilmore Summer Rec. 2008. Each week of camp is limited to 100 registrants.

DATES, TIMES, and FEES

Wilmore Summer Recreation is from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm, Monday - Friday, for each of the 8 one-week sessions, starting June 9th and ending August 1st. The cost will be \$75 per week (\$70 for each additional child). However, you may pay one lump sum of \$260 (\$240 for each additional child) and be eligible to attend all eight weeks of camp. **Either one week's fee payment of \$75 (\$70) or the lump sum of \$260 (\$240) must be received to process each registration form.** If you choose not to pay the \$260 (\$240) prior to camp starting, the fee will be \$75 (\$70) per week, for each of the eight weeks. No refunds after child attends at least one day of camp for that week.

9:00 am - 12:00 noon: Meet at WILMORE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

We will be using the playground, fields and area around WES

12 noon - 1:00 pm: Lunch in WES cafeteria

No programmed activities but supervision will be provided.

1:00 pm - 4:00 pm: WES and the Luce Center

Campers will be bused to the Luce center between 1:50 -2:15pm each day to use the swimming pool. Pick-up will be at 4:00pm from the front, left of the Luce Center. In case of inclement weather, we will be inside the Luce Center.

FYI

- Theme weeks are listed on the registration form for each week of camp. This simply means that whatever the theme listed will be the predominant activity of the week, but not the only activity. We will do stations and teach proper sports skills/activities, have games to practice these skills, etc. There will also be scheduled guest speakers/instructors. There will still be a variety of activities offered each week.
- There will be no camp on Friday, July 4th due to the holiday.
- If your child needs any medications during the camp hours you will need to send the medication in the original bottle along with a signed and dated note each day that the child is to receive medication (no exceptions).
- We provide lunch and a snack daily. Enclosed you will find a financial income form that MUST be completed and returned with each camp application regardless of whether you qualify. This information is confidential. **It helps us if you qualify, because if 50% or more of campers qualify for free or reduced lunch prices we can provide free lunches for all campers.** We have always been able to provide lunches in the past. As always, campers may bring their own lunch.

DEPARTURE PROCEDURES

All campers must be signed out by an authorized adult anytime they are leaving camp. If your child walks home, you must sign the section on the registration form giving them permission to sign themselves out. They may only sign out at 4:00pm and once they have signed out, we are not responsible for them.

TRIPS

Summer Rec. has some exciting trips scheduled for this summer. Extra costs for each trip will be collected prior to departure the day of the trip. Cash or check is acceptable. **Your child must wear their Summer Rec. t-shirt on trip days and bring a lunch!**

BEHAVIOR STANDARDS

Our rules are simple but consistently enforced to provide a safe environment for everyone. They are as follows:

- No fighting or harmful behavior towards campers or camp staff.
- No stealing, foul or offensive language or disrespectful behavior towards anyone.
- No leaving the group or the facility without notifying a counselor.

DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES

Each disciplinary case is treated individually based upon severity of the incident. Discipline includes verbal warnings, time-out of activities, contacting parents and eventual removal from camp.

WHAT CAMPERS NEED

Campers need to bring any sports equipment that corresponds with what activities are scheduled, tennis shoes, appropriate clothing and swimwear, a water bottle and a positive attitude. **Females must wear one-piece swimsuits.** It is helpful for each camper to have a bag and have their name on each item. Please do not bring any expensive or valuable personal items that could be easily misplaced or left behind. "Gameboys" and "Walkmans" may only be brought on trip days for use on the bus and camp staff are not responsible for these items. Trading cards or "toys" are not to be brought to camp anytime.

VOLUNTEERS

Summer Recreation would love to have you, the parent, join us for any daily activity or special trip. We can always use the extra hands and would love for you to see the campers in action. Simply let the director know what activities you would like to help chaperone.

MOVIES

Movies may be viewed on days when the weather does not permit regularly scheduled activities to take place. Summer Recreation staff will use good discretion on showing movies suitable to all the age groups at camp. Only movies rated 'G' or 'PG' will be viewed.
